Cremation arrangements are by Anderson-Burriss Funeral Home and Crematory. Bennie Kay Mullins was born on August 21, 1949 to Colonel George H. "Moon" Mullins and Jean Robinson Mullins in Memphis, Tennessee and passed away peacefully on December 22, 2012 in Enid. Bennie lived many places as her father was transferred while in the United States Air Force. Her family moved to Enid in 1964 where she attended and then graduated from Enid High School in 1967. She attended and graduated from Central State University (now the University of Central Oklahoma) in 1971 with a bachelor's degree in sociology. She was a member of Alpha Gamma Delta Sorority. Bennie worked in the Juvenile Division of the Oklahoma City Police Department following graduation in 1971 until she moved back to Enid in 1976 to become the Garfield County Juvenile Officer. She left the Juvenile Office in 1986 to become the Executive Director of RSVP, the Retired Senior Volunteer Program of Enid, a position she held until her death. During her life Bennie was a member of the Enid Police Civil Service Commission, the Governor's Commission on the Status of Women, the Enid Human Rights Commission, the Altrusa Club of Enid, the Enid Men's Garden Club, the Garfield County Alliance on Aging, the Garfield County Foster Care Review Board, the Board of Directors of the Northwest Oklahoma Pastoral Care Association, the Board of Directors of Youth & Family Services of Enid and North Central Oklahoma,

the Board of Directors of Wheatland Mental Health, the Enid Public Transit Authority Advisory Board, the Older Americans Volunteer Program, the National Association of RSVP Directors, the National Association of RSVP Programs, University Place Christian Church and "Girls Night Out". Bennie was preceded in death by her grandparents and parents. She is survived by Joyce Yauk with whom she shared the farm she loved, her sister, Pat Evans, nieces, Christi Evans and Terri Thompson, nephew, Joe Evans, and his wife, Andrea, the children of her nieces and nephews, and a large extended family along with many, many friends and pets.
