



Donald August Thieme

December 13, 1922 - May 10, 2015

The funeral service for Donald A. Thieme, age 92, will be at 2:00 P.M. Wednesday, May 13, 2015, at Central Christian Church, with Rev. Don Johnson officiating. Burial will follow in Memorial Park Cemetery, with arrangements by Anderson-Burriss Funeral Home. Visitation with the family will be Tuesday evening 5:30 to 7:00 PM at the funeral home. Donald was born to Oswald and Frieda (Naumann) Thieme on December 13, 1922, in Burrton, Kansas, and passed away Sunday, May 10, 2015, in Enid. Donald graduated from Burlington High School. He attended Northwestern University in Alva and then graduated from the University of Oklahoma with a degree in Geology. Don then earned his Masters Degree from Phillips University. He served in the U.S. Navy during World War II. On June 4, 1955, Don married Annabell Kuhnemund in Enid, where they made their home. He worked for Phillips Oil, Atomic Energy Commission, and then taught at Hennessey High School and Enid High School for over twenty years. After Annabell's death, Donald married Corinne Cormier of California. Donald was a member of Enid Briggs Lions Club, a 32nd Degree Mason, and recently involved in Don Blanding Poetry Club. He was a volunteer at Midgley Museum and very active member of Central Christian Church, where he has served as a deacon for many years. Donald is survived by daughter, Dr. Robyn Thieme-Sklar of Dallas; son Ronald Douglass Thieme of Billings; two grandchildren, Rachael and Ryan Sklar of Dallas; brother James Thieme of Dallas; sister Rita Diel of Newkirk; and wife Corinne of California.
