



## Doris Ann Fair

October 8, 1931 - December 5, 2013

The funeral service for Doris Ann Fair will be at 10:00 AM Wednesday, December 11, 2013, at New Hope United Methodist Church, with Dr. Sheila Combs-Francis officiating. Burial will be at 2:00 PM in Rose Hill Cemetery in South Haven, Kansas. Arrangements are by Anderson-Burriss Funeral Home. Doris Ann was born on the family farm near Kellogg, Kansas to Stephen and Mildred Ogden on October 8, 1931. She attended Rainbow Bend School and Oxford High School, graduating in 1949. Doris began working in Arkansas City, Kansas. She met Wendell "Bud" Fair at the Newkirk Roller Rink in 1950, and married January 9, 1951, at her parents home. They lived in Arkansas City and Blackwell before moving to a farm near Hunnewell, Kansas. Their daughter, Debra Sue, was born in January 1955. After moving to a farm west of Braman, they welcomed their son James Lee to the family in December 1960. They farmed there until a house fire forced them to move in 1967. They purchased the original Fair Family homestead farm located four miles west of Hunnewell along the Oklahoma stateline. As the kids grew up, Doris began working outside the home at South Haven Nursing Home, South Haven Schools, Karl's Grocery, and Farmers Co-op in Caldwell. When they sold the farm and moved to Enid, Doris worked at Lambert's, Enid Public Schools, and Jr. Welfare League's Return Engagement. She retired to care for Bud as his health deteriorated. They celebrated sixty years of marriage a few months before his death in May, 2011. Doris was a loving Mom, Grandma, and Great-Grandma. She and Bud attended hundreds of school programs, ballgames,

and music productions that their children and grandchildren took part in. She enjoyed doing things with her friends as well as taking part in the choir and United Methodist Women at New Hope United Methodist Church. Doris attended events with Church Women United, and so much more. Surviving are her daughter, Debbie and husband Chuck Hart of Enid; her son James of South Haven, Kansas; granddaughters Andrea (Matt) Palmer of Edmond, Tammy (Cody) Nebhut and their children, Jason and Hayden, of Vici; Lesly Fair and her sons, Mak and John, of Caldwell, Kansas; two step-sisters, Dorothy Stevens and Joan Wood, both of Wichita, Kansas.
