memory for his grandson Jeff. Glen was a great instructor of many things, from driving lessons to short sheeting beds and was always up for a cross country road trip with his grandson Nicholas or picking blackberries with Hannah. Glen always lit up when he saw Lynsey come into the room and delighted in sharing Oklahoma history with David, Ora and anyone else who wanted to listen and soak up his wisdom. Glen never met a stranger that he couldn't talk to and find common ground, enjoy a good conversation with and probably find out they knew or were related to some of the same people. Glen always had a marvelous ornery glint in his beautiful blue eyes....
