Hazel enjoyed all the family events and the more the merrier, she never turned anyone away. She enjoyed crafts and quilting, and would make handmade gifts for her family and friends. Hazel loved flowers and enjoyed working in her flower

gardens until her eyesight prevented her from doing so. Hazel was a member of Marshall Rebekah's, played softball for a Marshall and Enid women's softball team, and was a member of First Baptist Church, Enid.
