Leo Jueschke, age 95, of Ponca City, Oklahoma, went home to be with the Lord on Sunday, October 25, 2020.

Leo was born on July 18, 1925 in Tonkawa, Oklahoma to Anthony John and Mollie Ann Schermack Jueschke.

He graduated from Marland High School in 1943 and entered the U.S. Army in 1945. Leo served until his discharge in 1946. He worked for an equipment company, and JG Paris Furniture Store as a carpet layer until starting Jueschke Carpet Service. Leo loved farming.
