Marvin was born September 7, 1945 in Enid, Oklahoma to Vernon and Vera (Siegmann) Powell and passed away February 12, 2025 in Enid, Oklahoma.

Marvin graduated from Covington High School. On November 22, 1963, he married his sweetheart, Sheryl Baker in Enid. The same day as President Kennedy's assassination. Marvin served on the City of Enid electrical appeals board, served three terms on Garber Co-Op Board and two terms on the Pioneer School Board. He owned and operated Powell Electric in Enid for 35 years. In 2002, Marvin and Sheryl moved to the farm near Covington, where they have resided since. He enjoyed being a farmer.

He was a member of the Enid Corvette Club and First Baptist Church, Covington.
