She couldn't hear very well and she liked having someone with her at night. Of course it was a given that we had to go shopping. But neither one of us wanted to spend much money. So we hit all the sales and all the thrift stores. Our biggest thrill was when we found new or almost new items for a dollar or less. Then of course mid afternoon brought a craving for something to eat or drink. We always hit Happy Hour at Sonic in mid afternoon. We were hooked on mozzarella sticks (we called it fried cheese) and onion rings. We would sometimes get slushes but she mostly liked root beer. Then to the grocery store to get stuff for supper but usually just got a frozen chocolate pie for her and Key Lime for me. Then she discovered frozen Cheesecake and liked it better. Then we would get a salad from Braums or chicken from KFC. We would also get a movie to watch. We always teased each other we'd get a movie with sex and violence but never did get anything too wild. I made sure we would get a movie or we would watch Fox News all evening. Actually she would watch it and I would read One day of shopping was about all she could handle so we started taking little drives around town looking at where everyone used to live. We made a trip to see Ryan, my grandson, and Maddie his wife and my new great-granddaughter, Emma, when she was a baby. Short really enjoyed that. The last out of town trip we took was to Cleo Springs the week before she passed away. She had been wanting to go out there for a while but it never worked out. I'm so thankful we were able to go. Her grandmother Brewers house was still there and in pretty good shape. There was no one there or we would have stopped to talk to them. She spent a lot of time out there when she was growing up and she was so excited to see it. Thank you Lord for that special time with her. I've lost a beautiful aunt and best friend but I know she's celebrating with all our family in heaven.
