Robert Gregory Mack was born May 9, 1934 on the family farm near Bison to Charlie and Lucy (Felber) Mack and departed this life May 28, 2015. He attended St. Joseph's Catholic school in Bison through the 8th grade and Waukomis High School graduating with the class of 1952. In December, 1952 he married Carleen Simmons at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Bison. To this union 9 children were born. Robert completed a Dale Carnegie course and was employed by Enid Concrete Company for 44 years retiring in 1998 as the manager. He raised cattle and wheat. He married the former Shirley Jean Campbell on May 3, 1997 at Eureka Springs, Arkansas. They resided on the farm near Bison until 2009 when they moved to Enid. Robert was a lifetime member of St. Joseph Catholic Church, President of the Redi-Mix Association, serving on the board for many years, a lifelong member of Bison Cemetery Board serving for many years, and was a member of Homebuilders Association. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus.
